





We believe in The Esplanade being a vibrant community where all people sharing our park and our stories are proud Esplanadians.

Jamii's programming fosters a sense of pride and belonging to The Esplanade, offers opportunities for social interaction, encourages neighbours to (re)claim ownership of our public spaces and contributes to empowering Esplanadians.

We initiate, curate and produce arts-based community-engaged projects and events that are free of charge, welcoming to everyone, and are taking place in or near David Crombie Park.

Since inception in 2011, Jamii organized 159 workshops, directly engaged 496 people in a creative process, produced 60 public events, and presented to an audience of more than 45,000.

Jamii receives support from Toronto Arts Council, Ontario Arts Council, and Ontario Trillium Foundation.

Jamii is Swahili for "community".

#### forty-one // book

Written by 53 students from Market Lane Public School and St Michael's Catholic School, "FORTY-ONE Neighbours" is a portrait book that features 41 people, each living in one of the participating countries of the 2015 Toronto Pan Am/Parapan Am Games and having a personal link to The Esplanade neighbourhood. 39 photographers from the Americas participated in the project. 600 copies were printed and distributed locally and internationally.

"FORTY-ONE Neighbours" was launched on April 14th, 2015 at the St Lawrence Hall with 150 people in attendance.

#### forty-one // mural

Inspired by the book "FORTY-ONE Neighbours", a mural was created during an 8-week process under artistic leadership of Nick Sweetman. Seven Esplanadian painters designed and painted the mural at the "Circle/Stonehenge" (The Esplanade & Frederick St). It represents all landmasses in a mixed arrangement, with 41 dots spread throughout and all connected to each other by a ribbon.
